President's Message



This year has been a spectacular year for the Foundation and SRHS. We will have given over \$100,000 to the school for the first time ever. Considering that we started with a contribution of \$500 in the first year this is quite an accomplishment. The grants ranged from 'Soup to Nuts' as we like to say. We have funded new athletic uniforms, computer for various departments, video/DVD equipment for Art Quest programs,

helped fund lights at Nevers Field, awarded two \$1,000 scholarships and many, many more projects. We have truly helped every department at the school. The school knows that the Foundation has no agenda other than to help SRHS and that very simple mission statement has kept us going all these years.

Last year's issue described the need for lights at Nevers Field and the possibility of revenue from the concession stand at Nevers during night games. Since that has been accomplished, Nevers Field has been a raging success! It was quite a night on October 22nd when we held the first ever night game at Nevers Field. The stands were packed and the energy contagious. And fans were knee deep at the concession stand. Another group on campus, the Panther Athletic Club (PAC) has organized and run the concessions and netted over \$20,000 for the sports programs. The lighting project has been a huge success with district track meets, championship soccer matches and even semi-pro soccer held there with PAC always managing the concessions. Our own Chris Zeek was instrumental in getting the lights and deserves credit for a job well done.

The Foundation has been involved in many projects at the school but we could not do it without your generous donations. I want to personally thank you for your support this year and in the past. We continue to make a great school better. What a great feeling to help your old high school and know that we are all trying to keep it as the best high school in the county.

There are many other projects on-going at the school. Currently we are trying to expand the Auto shop and improve the Agriculture facilities at the school (barns etc.). So thanks again-we couldn't do it without you.

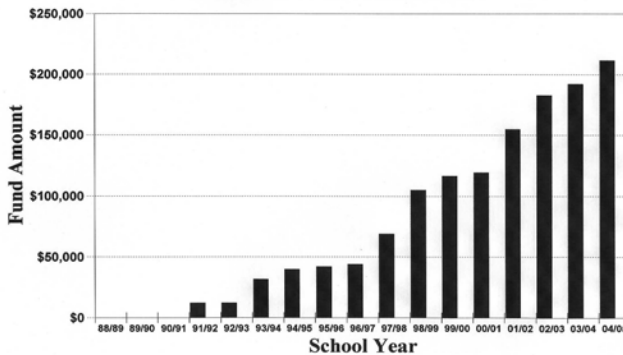

Many of these gifts have been given for specific purpose where the annual earnings of the fund are distributed to that purpose at SRHS. Not every fund has a specific purpose and the earnings are distributed annually by the Foundation towards current needed programs.
