President's Report



I am in awe of the generosity of our individual and business contributors. You collectively have helped to bring this Foundation to its most successful year ever. The passion driving this achievement is certainly the desire to create the finest enhanced educational experience available for students at Santa Rosa High School. This goal is ongoing, and with quickly changing technological advances at

the same time that State budgets are limited, the need is very great.


You will see within this newsletter our record list of annual grants totaling \$134,180.49 presented by each individual grant. This list includes both program funding grants and student scholarships. I would like to highlight a few of these individual grants. First, the amount of student scholarships grew to twelve this year, three were Foundation scholarships and nine were donor-endowed scholarships. Second, significant grants were made to vocational programs including automotive and welding; science and agriculture programs also were financially benefited as well as enhancements to the auditorium. The Greenhouse Project was completed through gifts from the Shirley Hutchinson Trust and from an anonymous donor. The auditorium lighting needs were completed by a gift from the Marie Lauritzen estate. The science department was presented with several grants from the general fund but was further assisted by an anonymous donor with a significant grant to purchase updated microscopes. From the Foundation's general fund, a \$6,000 grant was given to instrumental music to offset travel costs for students performing in Spain and Portugal. This year's grants, combined with all of our grants going back to the Foundation's origin in 1988, total \$897,894. I am positive the Foundation will significantly break the \$1,000,000 mark during the 07/08 school year which will also be our 20th anniversary.

Another achievement is to report the growth of our Permanent Endowment Fund. The fund grew over \$70,000 this year primarily because of bequests establishing three scholarship funds. Those funds are The Lisa Nilson Agriculture Scholarship fund, The Berta Wiggins Golf Scholarship Fund and The Lucky Jade Scholarship Fund in memory of Jack J. Kellar. The Permanent Endowment Fund starts the 07/08 year at \$296,988. As these three examples vividly show, including the Foundation in your estate plan can provide ongoing income for programs and scholarships that are of special interest to the donor for perpetuity.

This Foundation has been recognized by the school board several times this year for the significant grants made to enhancing the student experience at SRHS. You as donors are the key to this success. You can be assured that your Foundation Board of Directors will do everything it can to continue to provide careful stewardship of the Foundation's assets and to help donors realize their specific wishes in how they may underwrite student enhancement programs.



New Scholarship Established

A scholarship for music and drama students and to honor the memory of Jack Kellar ('39) was recently created by his daughters, Judy Kellar Fox ('65) and Joanne Kellar ('67). This fund, which totals \$50,000, will each year award scholarships to music and drama students who will continue to study music or drama at a two or four-year college or university or at a music conservatory.

A long-time partner with fellow SRHS alum Bob Call ('39) at Santa Rosa Auto Parts, Kellar loved SRHS and his hometown. He was said to claim that drama teacher Glen Guymon and music director Helen Cochrane provided him with the direction and

motivation he needed. Kellar continued his drama and music studies in college.

Kellar played the lead opposite Verona Lindau Tate ('39) in the 1939 operetta production of "The Lucky Jade." Accordingly, the Kellar sisters have named the new scholarship

Dad's life proved that grades are not necessarily an indicator of success.

Dad was a 1939 graduate of Santa Rosa High School, where he particularly enjoyed his music classes

and playing in a dance band. He had the lead (opposite Verona Lindau Tate) in the 1939 operetta "The Lucky Jade." For that reason, we'd like to name these scholarships "The Lucky Jade: In Memory of Jack J. Kellar."


Our list of annual contributions is vital and addresses our immediate needs. Have you ever thought about creating a permanent fund that will assure the Foundation an ongoing source of income? By creating an endowment you can accomplish this and your endearing benevolence will perpetuate your support of a cause that's close to your heart. Your gift can underwrite a particular project, maintain a continuing program or provide annual scholarships. You can establish the fund now with an outright gift and add to it each year, or you can arrange future funding by means of a bequest or life income program. And fittingly, the fund may be named for yourself or a loved one.

But how does an endowment work? An endowment is a fund established with cash, securities, or other assets to provide income for the program or scholarship. The fund may be restricted or unrestricted. You can instruct us to restrict use of the income for your defined program or you may allow the Foundation Board to direct the income to current programs needing funding. In short, you set the criteria for your gift. The current annual spending rate is 5% of the endowment fund amount. In arriving at the current rate, careful consideration is taken to maintain the principal gift value. An example is an endowment fund of \$20,000 would produce an annual income of \$1,000 to support a program or scholarship.

Once you have decided to create an endowment and memorial, you have several methods of funding and your benevolence may be rewarded by substantial tax savings. The most common ways of establishing your fund is by gifts of cash, appreciated assets, retirement plan assets, life insurance, or bequests. You should consult with your attorney or CPA for legal or tax matters.
