## Finding the Heart of the Panther

What could the Heart of the Panther be--a person, a special program, an idea, an organization? What could keep the beat of the Panther Heart pumping away?

Four years ago, the development committee optimistically embraced the goal of increasing the Foundation's Unrestricted Endowment Fund to \$1 million. While progress has occurred--the \$160,000 donated to One Thousand Panthers has been added -- we are yet a long way from the goal.

When the \$1 million is reached and invested, an annual return of \$50,000 is a real possibility. This amount is very close to that generated by present fundraising events--Crab Feed, Polenta Feed and Golf Tournament.

A stumbling block to efforts is reaching alumni and friends to seek their participation. Certainly, Foundation membership has been contacted, but

only 140 participated. While I am thrilled with that response, we have to get 'er done! I ask myself, how can I encourage additional Panthers to join the parade?

Inspiration came from the 20 individuals who each gave more than

\$1,000. I interviewed two, Larry Weese 1964 and Alana Kelly 1978, and asked three questions: 1) What is your favorite memory of SRHS, 2) Why did you choose to donate to OTP, and 3) What would you say to fellow alumni or friends to encourage them to donate to OTP and to donate multiple times? Their answers are profound and charming.

# Success Raises New Questions

By any measure, one would agree that the SRHS Foundation had a banner year fueled by our generous donors. The addition of the Fleck scholarships, successful fundraising events, donor endowment contributions and a very successful Annual Fund Campaign brought historic Annual Academic Expenditures

to \$2,044,699 since our inception in 1988.

A recent article in the Press Democrat reported that SRHS received more money per student through private fundraising than any other public high school in Santa Rosa. An improving economy and the promise of an increase in State funding to high schools bode well for the future. How could things be any better?

However, this is a time for cautious optimism, and the Foundation must assess expected funding resources for current student programs. Research shows that increased State funding will not make a significant addition to funding student program needs at the school level. The money generated from Foundation fundraising events is volatile and could produce lower net income in future years. While the Foundation's endowment fund has grown to record levels, 85% of the fund's earning is mostly committed to restricted scholarships for graduating seniors. All of these issues point to a continuing need for the Foundation to offer programs that will assist in raising funds that get "into the classroom" and support current extra-curricular

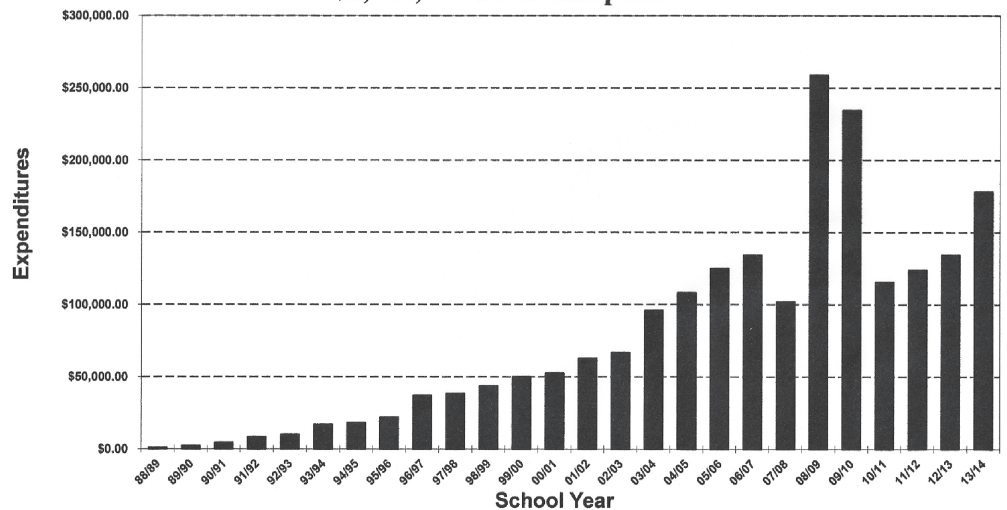
programs. In short, we need to expand our efforts to raise unrestricted endowed or directed departmental funds.

The Foundation has several programs available for members and friends to accomplish this goal:

1. Give an unrestricted gift in any amount for broad disbursement to current school needs
2. Direct any amount to a particular department at SRHS
3. Send an unrestricted gift in any amount as an addition to our SRHS Foundation Permanent Endowment Fund
4. Join the ONE THOUSAND PANTHERS Unrestricted Fund with a gift of \$1,000 or greater
5. Establish an endowed Restricted Fund with a minimum amount of \$10,000 to benefit a specific department, club or program
6. Consider an Employer Matching gift if available
7. Gifts of appreciated marketable stocks or bonds are tax efficient gifting methods

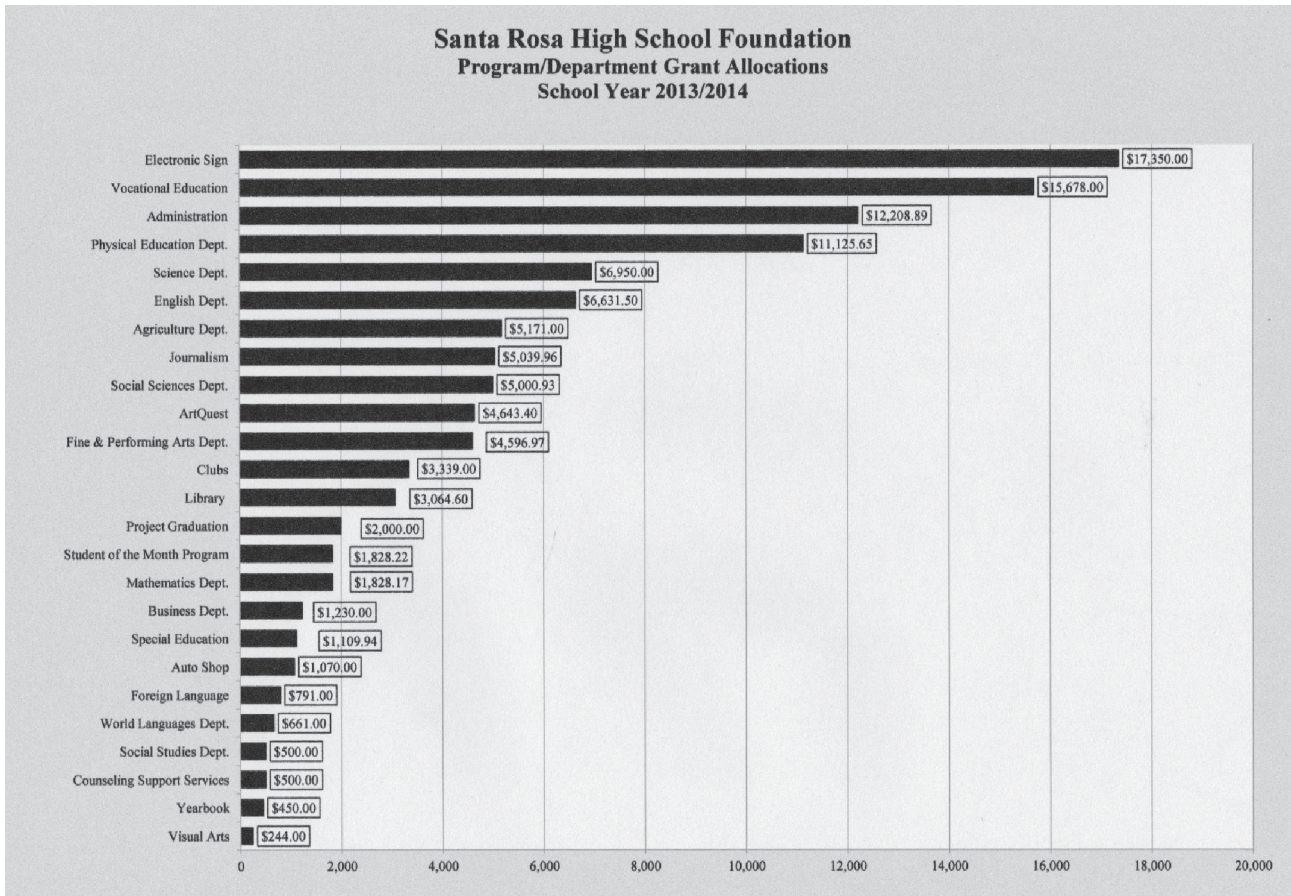
