ANNUAL FUND CAMPAIGN 2016/2017 EQUALS MONEY TO THE CLASSROOM

This year's Annual Fund Campaign contributed significant financial support to school and student enhancement programs as well as to the Foundation's Endowment Fund. The Board of Directors sincerely appreciates all of our donors for assisting the Foundation to fulfill its Campaign mission of getting money into the classroom. \$28,779 was raised during this year's campaign that supported the following Departments and Programs: Administration, Agriculture, ArtQuest, Athletics, Auditorium, Career Technology, English, Fine Arts, Music, Project Graduation, Science, Social Studies, Special Education, World Language, Yearbook and Various Student Clubs. In addition, our ONE THOUSAND PANTHERS program has added \$34,725 in new unrestricted endowment donations.

First I am excited to announce that during the 2016/2017 fiscal year we awarded \$202,233.72 in Grants & Scholarships benefiting the students and faculty at SRHS. This would not have been possible without the support of our members and donors.

The Polenta Feed in April 2017 was a sellout and raised a new record in funds \$31,016.98. The success of the Polenta Feed is due in part to the excellent leadership of Paulette Gomes, chair, the polenta committee and our volunteers. JoAnn MacDonald, prior chair of the committee, relinquished the position to Paulette after a two year overlap. Many thanks to JoAnn for her 15 years of devotion to the Polenta Feed and the Foundation.

This year Mike Daniels, founding and past member of the Board and Art Horner Faculty Advisor were honored by the SR City Council for the Santa Rosa High School Museum. They received the City of Santa Rosa Merit Award for exceptional volunteer efforts in expanding the community's historical knowledge of Santa Rosa.

This year I also got involved with the scholarship presentations. My husband Todd and I took pictures of each senior receiving their scholarships; the looks on their faces were priceless. Over the years Nadine Smedshammer, Chair & Board Member, has made the presentation very personal; she described the donor and story behind each award. The pictures were launched on Facebook, placed in the Foundations display case in the Main Hall at SRHS and a copy went to each recipient.

 and programs. This past school year, the Foundation has been able to fund \$202,234 in grants for student programs and scholarships which now totals \$2,618,958 since inception in 1988. Donors at all levels can match a variety of general or specific donations with their personal interests. For example, donors have given unrestricted cash gifts for broad disbursement, select or selected a specific department or program. They have made “memorial” or “in honor of” gifts, supported the ONE THOUSAND PANTHERS Unrestricted Endowment Fund or created a restricted program or scholarship fund (\$10,000 minimum).

The Annual Fund Campaign is an important part of the Foundation’s several immediate and longer-term fundraising programs. 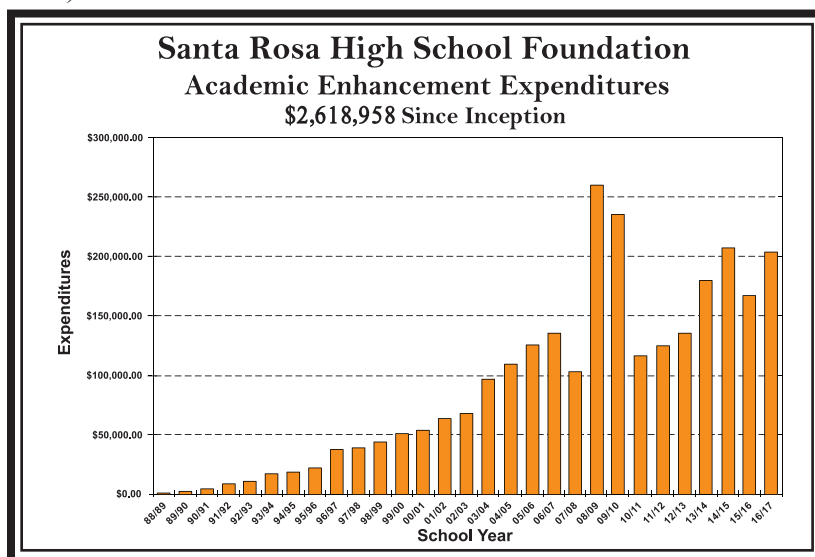

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SOME DEFINITIONS OF TERMS USED IN THIS ISSUE

PERMANENT ENDOWMENT FUND:

The Foundation’s “war chest.” Currently around \$2,850,000 in restricted and unrestricted funds. The Foundation’s spending policy is 5% annually with the approval of the Board. This policy has the goal of protecting the fund’s principal.

RESTRICTED FUNDS:

Monies that can *only* be used for stated purposes. For example, money only to be used for scholarships overseen by the Foundation’s Scholarship Committee and designated departments or programs.

UNRESTRICTED FUNDS:

Monies that can be used for *any need* the Board of the Foundation determines. Examples: classroom computers, classroom microscopes, and sports uniforms. Unrestricted funds, unless in the Permanent Endowment, can, if necessary, be spent in whole at any time for current needs. Unrestricted funds come from contributions, membership dues, and fundraising events like the Polenta Feed and Golf Tournament.

FLECK SCHOLARSHIPS:

About three quarters of the value of the Permanent Endowment Fund comes from the generous gift of the James and Marie Fleck Trust. Distributions from this restricted fund are used for scholarships and are consistent with the Foundation’s overall spending policy.

TOTEM POLES

For the past few years I have been on the Panther Project Fund Committee (PPF). We meet the Friday before each Tuesday Board Meeting at 6:30 am at Adele’s Restaurant. It was designed this way years ago to accommodate the Department Chairs and Teachers to insure they were back to school to begin their day.

Christine Lewis Giffen, SRHS Teacher for 5 years in Fine Arts and Department Chair of Fine Arts and Ceramics for 3 years plus Teacher Stephanie Nagorka came to our Panther Project Fund Committee (PPF) Meeting in April 2017 with the following request/project.

After last year’s project (see our last Spring newsletter) where a ceramic model of SRHS was meticulously researched and constructed, and is now on display in DeSoto Hall, the Ceramics and Fine Arts Department moved forward with a new project; and the Foundation awarded them \$2,500 for their new totem pole proposal.

Ms. Lewis Giffen presented a unique project for the Fine Arts/Ceramics classes. The Ceramics classes wanted to create 14 totem poles that would be displayed on the SRHS campus. Ms. Lewis Giffen described the totems as “larger than life”! All 5 Ceramic classes participated in the project; including freshman. They first did research on Native American Tribes and what the totem represents; a totem is a traditional monument to both community and kinship. Next they decided to design each totem to represent the various departments on campus, referring to the campus

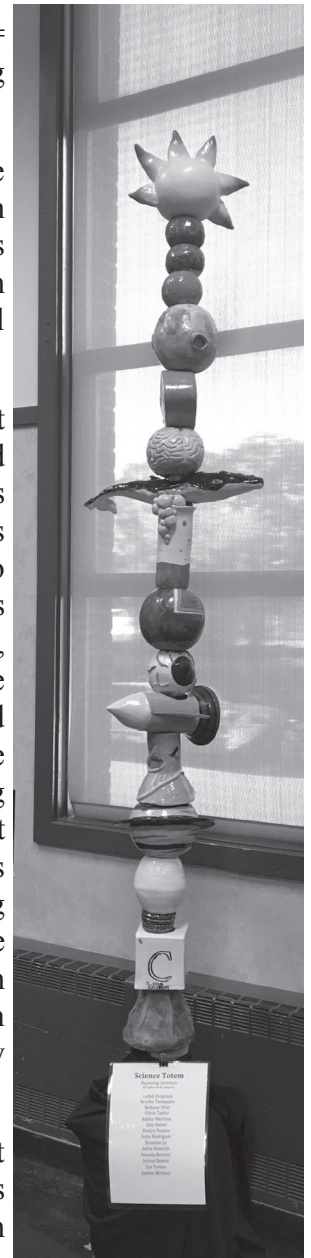
as a community. As stated by Ms. Lewis Giffen “We have such diverse departments with such unique attributes, we felt it would be nice to celebrate these with this year’s community project.” This meant the students would interview the Department Chairs on campus with a specific set of questions in mind. They then went to work designing the totems on paper for each Department. From there the actual pieces of the totem were drawn and crafted.

160 students worked on the project and energy in the classroom was high. One of the harder pieces to construct was the “Declaration of Independence” for the Social Studies Department.

The Totems were on display at the Fine Arts Showcase near the end of school year 2017. The totems have not been installed on campus but Ms. Lewis Griffen plans to work with the Department Chairs and principal Brad Coscarelli, to decide on placement of the totems. Teachers Eric Roberts and Tom Gutch also assisted with the project. Ms. Lewis Giffen along with the Fine Arts Department and Ceramics staff spent countless hours researching and pricing the materials that went into the totem poles. The Foundation looks forward to the installation on campus and will potentially include with the campus tours.
