THE PROPER CARE AND FEEDING OF A SCHOLARSHIP

The Santa Rosa High School Foundation has many important responsibilities. Among them are helping to create, maintain, and award approximately 35 endowed scholarships yearly. These scholarships are endowed in perpetuity, meaning their principal should stay intact indefinitely. The earnings from those invested principals become the scholarship award. Think of a prolific fruit tree. With the proper care and feeding, that tree (the principal) generates fruit (the scholarship awards) every year, while the tree remains undiminished.

Last spring, your Foundation awarded 12 Memorial scholarships and 23 Fleck Trust scholarships,

totaling \$88,225. The Memorial Scholarships honor the memories of over 10 SRHS graduates, teachers, and staff. The Fleck scholarships are possible because of the immense \$2,100,000 plus bequeath from the trust of SRHS graduate James Fleck and his wife Marie. Both the Memorial and Fleck scholarships are managed by your Foundation through the help of Morgan Stanley.

ONE FROM THE HEART

For twelve years, Nadine Smedshammer has chaired the Foundation committee responsible for selecting each year's scholarship winners. She and her committee work with SRHS teachers and counselors to make those important decisions. It's a lot of work, and a lot of pressure. But as you'll see below, in Nadine's own words, it's not without its rewards.

Each year when the scholarship recipients come to exchange their fall college schedule for their scholarship check, there are always one or two students that bring home the importance of what we do. A week ago, a young woman came to my home jumping with joy over winning one of our Fleck scholarships. Through tears and many hugs she explained that this scholarship made it possible for her to go to college (SRJC). She is the first member of her family to go, and it was her dream. As she left with one last hug, she was not alone with tears.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Our fiscal year wrapped up on 6-30-19 for the 2018/2019 school year! The Foundation had another eventful year. In September of 2018 we had the 23rd Annual Golf Tournament and we also had the 2nd Annual Show & Shine Car Show. The Golf Tournament had 80 golfer's tee off in a shotgun start format.



Total revenue for the event was 7% less than the prior year, primarily due to less people attending the dinner after the tournament, thus less money for the Live & Silent Auction. All in all the event was still a success with net income of \$18,704.00. Funds raised are directed each year to the Panther Project Fund. This was also the first year for a dedicated group of Board Members to solicit Raffle Prizes, and Live and Silent Auction Prizes. Overall we had a good selection of raffle and silent auction items donated by many generous donors!

Next a committee from the Board, Chaired by Paulette Gomes began work on the 24th Annual Polenta Feed in April 2019. The Polenta Feed tickets went on sale in Mid-January and were sold out by the 1st week of April to 650 Alumni, Friends and Teachers in attendance. Revenue for the Polenta feed was up by 10% over the prior year due in part to the addition of a 50/50 raffle, silent auction and a record Live Auction! The Polenta Feed had a net income of \$35,820.78! The funds from the Polenta Feed are also directed to the Panther Project Fund for the 2019/2020 school year.

The front sign underwent a new paint job in July! With the help of Kelly Moore Paint it was decided that the sign would need to undergo a soda blast to bring it back to the original concrete. Paul Troppy '84, current discus coach and professional painter with the assistance of Todd Beseda '73 took on the task of getting this done! Kelly Moore Paint donated the primer and paint needed and Paul and Todd donated their time and grit to get this done. I want to personally thank Paul Troppy, Kelly Moore Paints, Michael Burch of Scott Sign, Carol Galeazzi, North Bay Monument, plus my husband Todd

Beseda for their Community support in getting the project done before the start of the school year!

The 2018/2019 school year was an excellent Grant and Scholarship year! The Panther Project Committee awarded \$95,947.00 in grants, which were disbursed to 66 requests from teachers & Department Heads. The largest request, \$10,723.20 was the cost for plumbing and electrical work to install 5 new water stations around the campus. James Fleck and Memorial Scholarships were awarded to 35 graduating seniors totaling \$88,225.00. This year was also the first disbursement for the Lucy Holler Trust, \$26,377.40 was given to SRHS. (Calculations for the Lucy Holler Trust Disbursement was based on 4% return on principal, for 9 months or the term the Foundation had the funds in the investment pool.)

I would like to thank all of our Members, Alumni and Community supporters for their generous donations and loyalty to the Foundation. I am looking forward to the 2019/2020 school year! 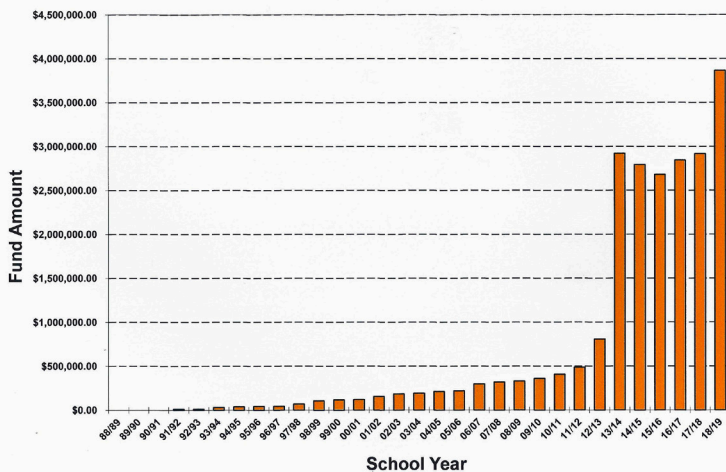

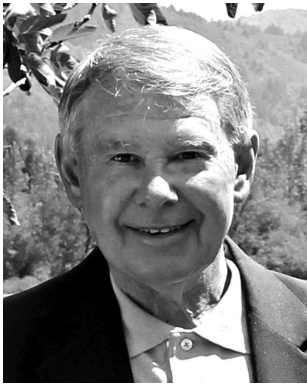

A generous \$31,270 was raised during this year's campaign that were directed to the following

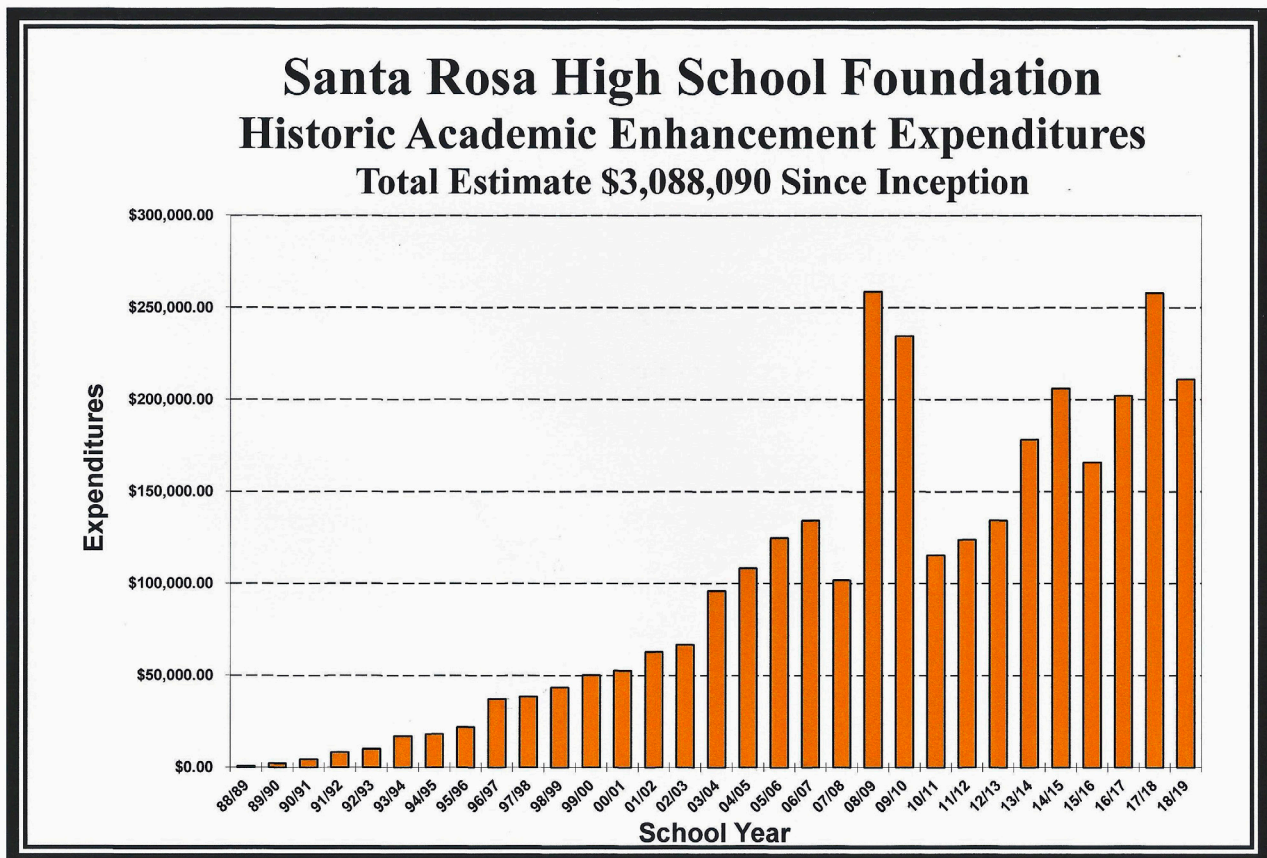
Departments and Programs: Administration, Agriculture, Athletics, Visual & Performing Arts, Industrial Technology. In addition, our ONE THOUSAND PANTHERS program has added \$63,317 in new unrestricted endowment donations.

The Annual Fund Campaign is an opportunity for Foundation members and other supporters to make tax deductible donations to SRHS students and programs. Donors at all levels can match a variety of general or specific donations with their personal interests. For example, donors have given unrestricted cash gifts for broad disbursement or selected a specific department

or program. They have made "memorial" or "in honor of" gifts, supported the ONE THOUSAND PANTHERS Unrestricted Endowment Fund or created a restricted program or scholarship fund (\$10,000 minimum).

The Annual Fund Campaign is an important part of the Foundation's immediate and longer-term fundraising programs. In this newsletter, we have added two historical charts where you will see the Foundation's progress in the growth of our Endowment Fund and the steady progress in our ability to fund student programs since our inception in 1988. 

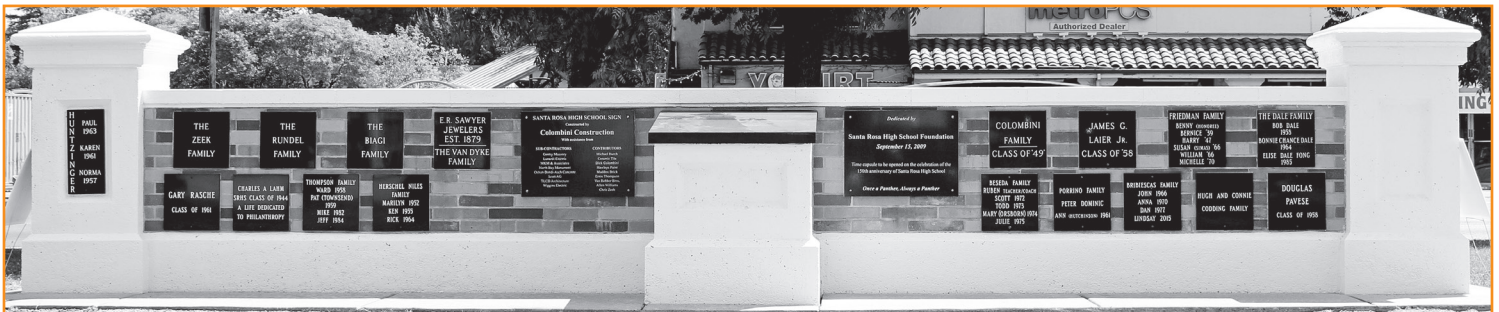
ONLY ONE PLAQUE REMAINING
