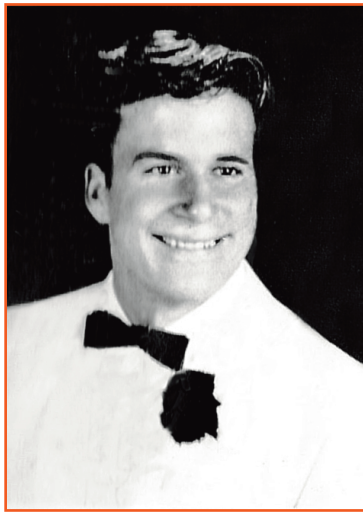

A FANTASTIC AND GENEROUS GIFT

The SRHS Foundation appreciates every donation made by its members and non-members. They all will help our high school's students. But on very rare occasions a donation comes in that simply knocks our collective socks off. Such is the bequest from the Gary Rasche Trust. Gary, a well-loved 1961 grad, left the school \$1,000,000 for its wood, auto, and metal shops.

Gary was a hometown boy, born in 1942 to parents who owned the local Coca Cola distributorship. He was popular at SRHS, spending much of his time as a cheerleader, and in the school's auto and wood shops. Those shops, especially auto shop, led him to adult pursuits and careers. He raced drag boats, and became one of the top racers in the country. He created and owned Boatland for 33 years, a local store catering to all boating things. And he restored, loved, and owned hot rods and other antique cars.

Each Christmas for 25 years, Gary would transform the front of his home with countless lights and lighted inflatables. The display drew throngs, and delighted children and adults alike. Gary's electrical bill for powering the exhibit from the day

after Thanksgiving until New Year's Day would run to over \$3,000.

He also owned a large ranch in Potter Valley with its own herd of Tule Elk. He hosted many a weekend at his ranch that included horseback riding and some hunting, followed by cocktails and a late dinner.

Since its inception, Gary supported the Foundation's "ONE THOUSAND PANTHERS" fund. He became its biggest donor.

Nancy Morrison, Gary's partner for 30 years, reflects that "He was a big hearted, kind man who loved his community. He was very philanthropically oriented and wanted to keep his charity local." He passed away at his home on August 14, 2018.

Morrison was also a trustee of Gary's Trust. When she, other family members, and their attorney met with Foundation representatives Mary Beseda and Doug Pavese, and Principal Kimberly Clissold to decide what to do with the money in Gary's enormous bequest, she reminded the group of how much he loved his time at high school and its shop classes. She remembered him saying, "Sometimes these programs are forgotten or are the first to go because of budget cuts. We need more trade people. Blue collar programs are always under-funded." That gave the group direction. It would be the first of several meetings that would lead to the final agreement on the dispersal of the bequeathed funds.

You might think that such a process would be fraught with tension and conflicting ideas. The opposite was true. Doug Pavese, chairman of the

The 2019/2020 School year and Fiscal year for the SRHS Foundation has proven to be a year of changes and challenges!



In the last newsletter we announced the postponement of the 25th Annual Polenta Feed to September 2020. Since that time the Polenta Feed was cancelled and ticket holders were contacted, 90% of the ticketholders donated the funds for the tickets back to the Foundation! The decision to cancel wasn't easy but with the restrictions set forth by the State and County due to the Coronavirus-Pandemic and the safety of our Members, Friends and Alumni the decision was made by the Polenta Committee and approved by the Board of Directors.

The Polenta Committee met in August and has decided to do an on-line auction with the items donated for the Polenta Feed. With the assistance of Greater Giving, host of an online auction site, we are hoping to launch our auction in October. Our April Board meeting was conducted utilizing Zoom, online face to face, where our Board Members adapted to the new format and made it work!! Our subsequent Board meetings have all been done using Zoom! We have also utilized Zoom for Finance Committee Meetings, Morgan Stanley Quarterly meetings, and come September we plan to utilize it for Panther Project Fund meetings at 6:30 am with the staff and instructors of SRHS requesting grant funds for their projects!

I am happy to announce we have two new Board Members! In July Christine Romani Tonelli, class of 1988 has decided to return to the Board, as her daughter has decided to attend SRHS this fall. During our August Board meeting Mark Noonan, class of 1970, was voted in! Marks parents, brothers and cousins all attended SRHS. I am excited to say that both of these new Board Members will enhance our capabilities.

On May 28th a group of our Board Members and their families, Donna Dennes Doyle, Paulette Guaspari Gomes, Todd Beseda, myself and Chris Zeek participated in a drive through pick up/drop off

car caravan at SRHS from 3 pm to 6 pm. We had the SRHS Bell ringing and our own Donna Doyle dressed as vintage Pandy congratulating and greeting each Graduate and their families. By the way it was a toasty 90* day and Pandy never stopped waving and dancing. (See picture inset)

In late July Staff at SRHS hosted a drive thru graduation where graduates dressed in their caps and gowns and a professional photo was taken of each graduate holding their diploma. Not the normal graduation but the next best thing! The Foundation offered a free 2year membership to each graduating senior!

From the 2019 Fiscal Year End to the 2020 FYE, the assets of the Foundation grew 23% or \$904,521. With total assets of \$4,896,036 due primarily to the Gary Rasche Fund contribution. Even with the shortened year the Panther Project Fund still gave out \$65,320 in Grants for a variety of projects throughout the school year. The Foundation also awarded Scholarships totaling \$107,950 to graduating seniors. I am proud to announce that our total support for the 2019-2020 school year was \$174,557. This is all made possible by the support of the Foundations members, friends and alumni, and couldn't be done without the continued loyalty and support of the staff at SRHS.

Foundation's Development Committee recalls, "The trustee and her team could not have been any nicer as we went through this important process." And trustee Morrison remembers, "It was extremely easy working with Doug Pavese. His financial background was great. Mary Beseda [Foundation President] was wonderful, Dr. Clissold was great. Tom Gutsch was so detailed about what he needed."

No one anticipated the size of Gary's gift, least of all Tom Gutsch, head of the Career Technical Education Department (CTE) that includes the wood, metal, and automotive shops. He recalls, "I was absolutely floored by it. What a fantastic, generous gift." But Gutsch was already familiar with Gary's generosity. As a 16 year old, Gary gave him a summer job at Boatland. When he received his first check, it was for far more than the agreed upon pay. When Gutsch rushed to the store and told him about the "mistake," Gary just smiled and said the extra money was to pay for his taxes.

Early in 2020, Pavese developed three separate proposals, and the group considered them all. In February, when the group met to pick one of the three, Gutsch was in attendance. He noted that he would like to see some of the money held in reserve for future needs, and everyone agreed. They unanimously approved proposal #3.

Here's what it looks like:

\$400,000 would be used for immediate capital improvements to the wood, auto, and metal shops. Tom Gutsch would submit a detailed list of how he thought the money should be spent. It would be called the Rasche Capital Improvement Fund.

\$240,000 would be endowed in perpetuity, with earnings going to fund six scholarships a year – two graduating senior recipients from each shop. It would be called the Rasche Student Scholarship Fund.

\$360,000 would be endowed in perpetuity, with earnings going to support the wood, auto, and metal shops. The department head (now Gutsch), with the help of each shop instructor and the school principal, would select each year's needs. This would be called the Rasche Shop Fund.

The Foundation would be responsible for investing the permanently endowed funds.

Additionally, Foundation President Mary Beseda is at work having plaques engraved for each shop in recognition of Gary's contribution. The Foundation will also submit a proposal to the School District Board to approve naming the area where the three shops are located in Gary's honor.

Tom Gutsch reflects, "It's amazing to me that he was that generous and shared my beliefs about shops. There should be pride and dignity in working with one's hands. And learning skilled trades should be just as important as going to college."

Nancy Morrison sums it up this way, "Gary would absolutely be pleased with the results. I like to think he's got a smile on his face looking down. And he might be saying 'You did a good job, Hon.'"

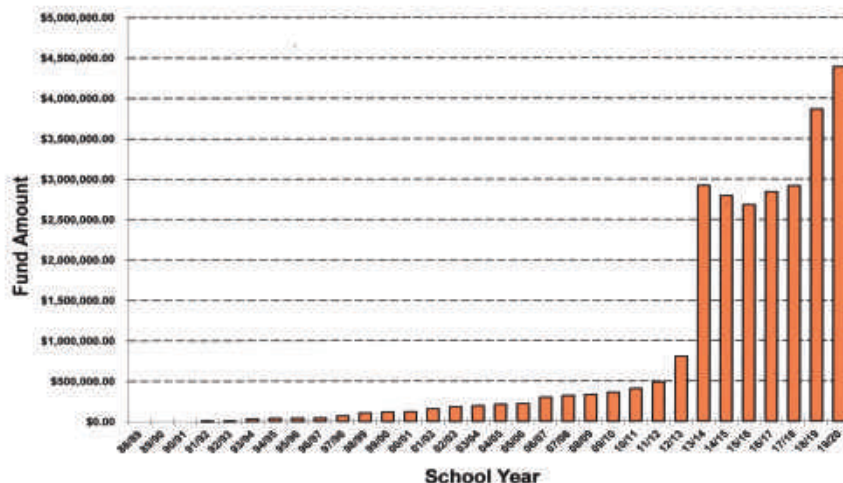

ANNUAL FUND CAMPAIGN 2019/2020 REPORT

A year ago in this newsletter, we announced experiencing a very successful Annual Fund Campaign. Who would have guessed that a virus called COVID 19 could affect the lives of all Americans and continues today? However, the SRHS Foundation has the best donors and supporters ever! The 19/20 Annual Fund Campaign contributed considerable

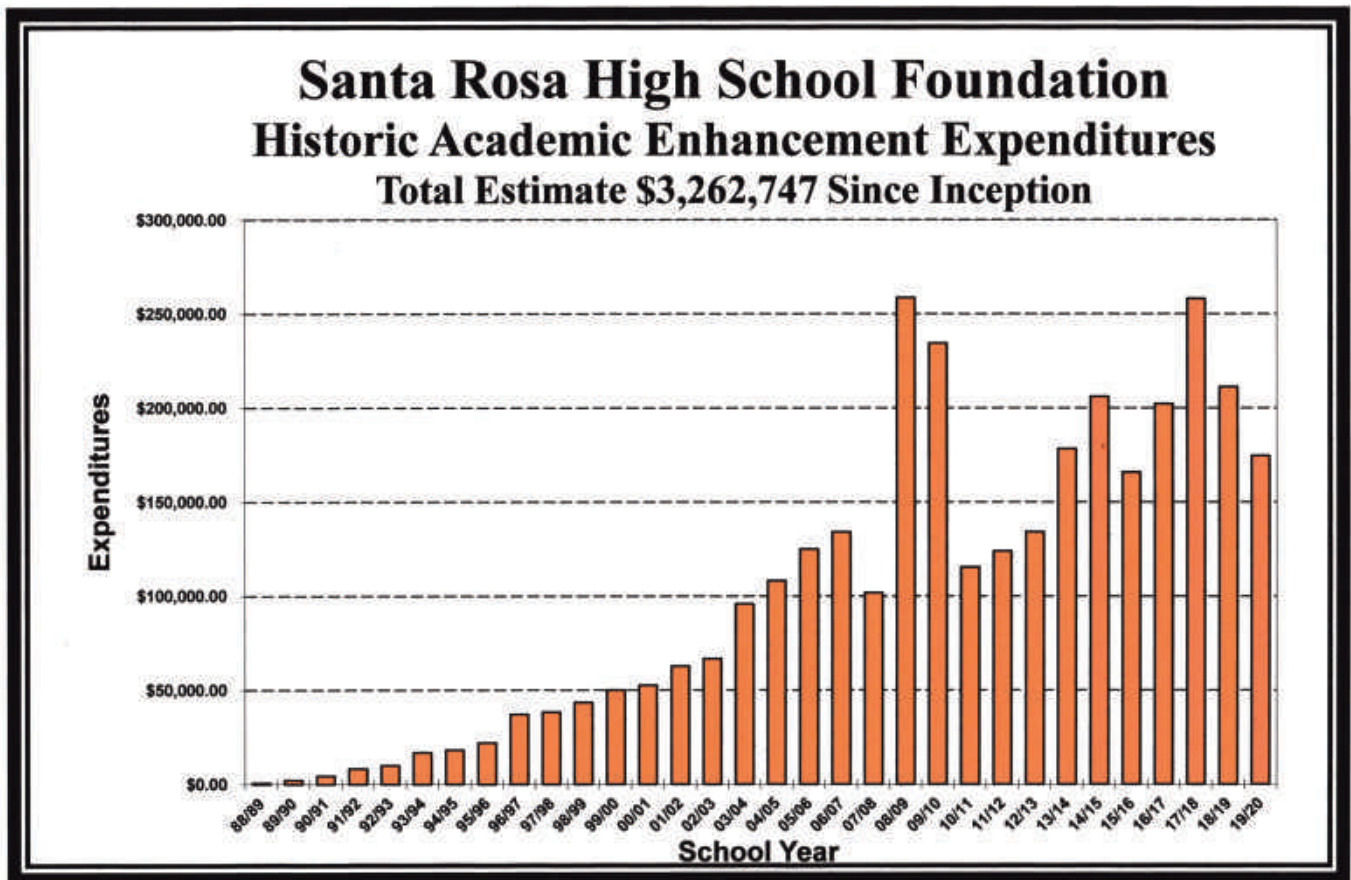
financial support to the school, student enhancement programs and to the Foundation's Endowment Fund. A generous \$14,240 was raised during this year's campaign that were directed to the following Departments and Programs: Academics, Athletics, Visual & Performing Arts and Industrial Technology. The Auto Shop, Metal Shop and Wood Shop were benefitted by the Gary Rasche bequest that is featured on the page 1 article.

This Campaign provides an opportunity for Foundation members and other SRHS supporters to make tax deductible donations to SRHS students and programs. Donors at all levels can match a variety of general or specific donations with their personal interests. For example, donors have given unrestricted cash gifts for broad disbursement or selected a specific department or program. They have

made "memorial" or "in honor of" gifts to support the ONE THOUSAND PANTHERS Unrestricted Endowment Fund or optionally created a restricted program or scholarship fund (\$10,000 minimum). This year, our ONE THOUSAND PANTHERS program has added \$37,954 in new unrestricted or restricted endowment donations.

The Annual Fund Campaign is an important part of the Foundation's immediate and longer-term fundraising programs. In this newsletter, we have added two historical charts where you will see the Foundation's progress in the growth of our Endowment Fund, now over \$4.6 million and the steady progress in our ability to fund student programs since our inception in 1988. That amount is now over \$3.2 million. We can't thank our donors and supporters enough in this difficult year.
