THE CAMPUS IS OPEN

The distance learning Zoom sessions are gone. So are the Plexiglas shields around desks spaced at six foot minimum distances. Hybrid Groups A and B, with their twice weekly classes are gone, too. After nearly a year and a half, Santa Rosa High is open again, with a great feeling of familiarity. Its 1900 plus students attend classes every day, five days a week. Classes begin at 8:30 am and end at 3:24 pm. According to Principal Kimberly Clissold, “The students are more acutely aware of the possibility of things effecting their ability to come to school than Santa Rosa High students in prior years. By and large all the students I talk to are just so grateful to be back on campus and to be here with their teachers.” Art Horner, History teacher and the school’s liaison to the SRHS Foundation, agrees. “It feels amazingly normal. The kids are really happy to be here.”

The return to normalcy comes at a price that feels small to students and teachers alike. All teachers and students are required to wear masks indoors. Every classroom has at least two air filters. Teachers have until September 24 to either be vaccinated or submit to weekly Covid testing. Students don’t have to be tested. And because of privacy laws, teachers don’t know which students have been vaccinated. Yet many students readily announce that they’re vaccinated, and consider their status a badge of

honor. Principal Clissold notes, “The students wear their masks indoors, but many of them also wear their masks outdoors not because they have to but because they’re good community members. They’re not just looking at what works for them, but what works for the larger community.”

Horner and many other teachers feel that they’re playing catch up on studies; so they try to incorporate some material from last year’s less than perfect teaching environment into their current lessons. Moreover, some students don’t know quite how to act in the classroom after being away so long. “They’re shy,” Horner suggests. And most freshmen and sophomores knew little of SRHS’s deep history and strong traditions. For them, a founding Foundation board member and former teacher, Mike Daniels, worked with the journalism class to create a document on SRHS’s spirit and traditions. They used as a springboard Daniels’ article from the Foundation’s Spring 2021 Newsletter, “Traditions Come and Go.” Every freshman and sophomore received a copy. Now they know, and don’t hesitate to wear orange and black, and sing the SRHS fight song every Friday.

There are silver linings around last school year’s clouds. Because of distance learning, every student now has a Chromebook laptop computer, and knows

how to use it. Teachers learned to give and receive student assignments electronically. Most teachers have carried at least some of that electronic teaching into the new school year. The “paperless classroom” is in, as both teachers and students boldly go into a digital future. Principal Clissold also noted the Panther pride that rose up during the last year. “It was very impressive to watch our students still work on, and really care about, having activities like the drive throughs and silent disco prom

they put together during the lockdown. It was not only impressive, it was inspirational.”

There is another group that worked hard to overcome the trials of the last school year: your SRHS Foundation. The support to students and teachers through the grants and scholarships it provides continued. And as you read the rest of this newsletter, you’ll see the many names of the alumni, friends, organizations, and companies that make that support possible.

PRESIDENT’S MESSAGE

This past fiscal year has been a challenge for the SRHS Foundation but we maneuvered through cohesively. We could not have done this without the support of our Members, Alumni and Friends.



Memorial contributions were up 100% compared with our previous year. **ONE THOUSAND PANTHERS** also had a good year, with an increase in contributions of 52% or \$19,940.00. **ONE THOUSAND PANTHERS** goal is to have 1000 panther supporters contribute \$1,000.00 to grow the unrestricted endowment to \$1M. Earnings from the endowment supports the Panther Project Fund. Membership was also up 7%. Members of the Foundation receive our quarterly newsletter and have early access to ticket sales for events!

The Foundation had three new scholarship funds developed this year, bringing the number of scholarships awarded to 44 to deserving seniors! After 16 years at the helm of the Scholarship Committee, Nadine Smedshammer has turned the reins over to Monica Baldenegro and Kristine Erken as co-chairs. Nadine saw the Foundation scholarships go from 5 in 2005 to 44 in 2021! Nadine will be remaining on the Board and the committee as a consultant. If you are considering

Throughout the year the Foundation conducted meetings via Zoom, including the awarding of scholarships and Student of the Month certificates with students and their families. Thus far the start of the 2021/2022 school year appears more normal with Freshman orientation in person on campus.

Foundation plans for a November Polenta Feed have been placed on hold, but watch for an announcement in January 2022 for an April 2022 Polenta Feed.

Beyond the scholarships the Foundation was able to support the school, students, and teachers with \$41,695.00 from the Panther Project Fund. Requests were different this year, from enhancements to the batting cage to the funding of the Holiday Tree Lighting drive through.

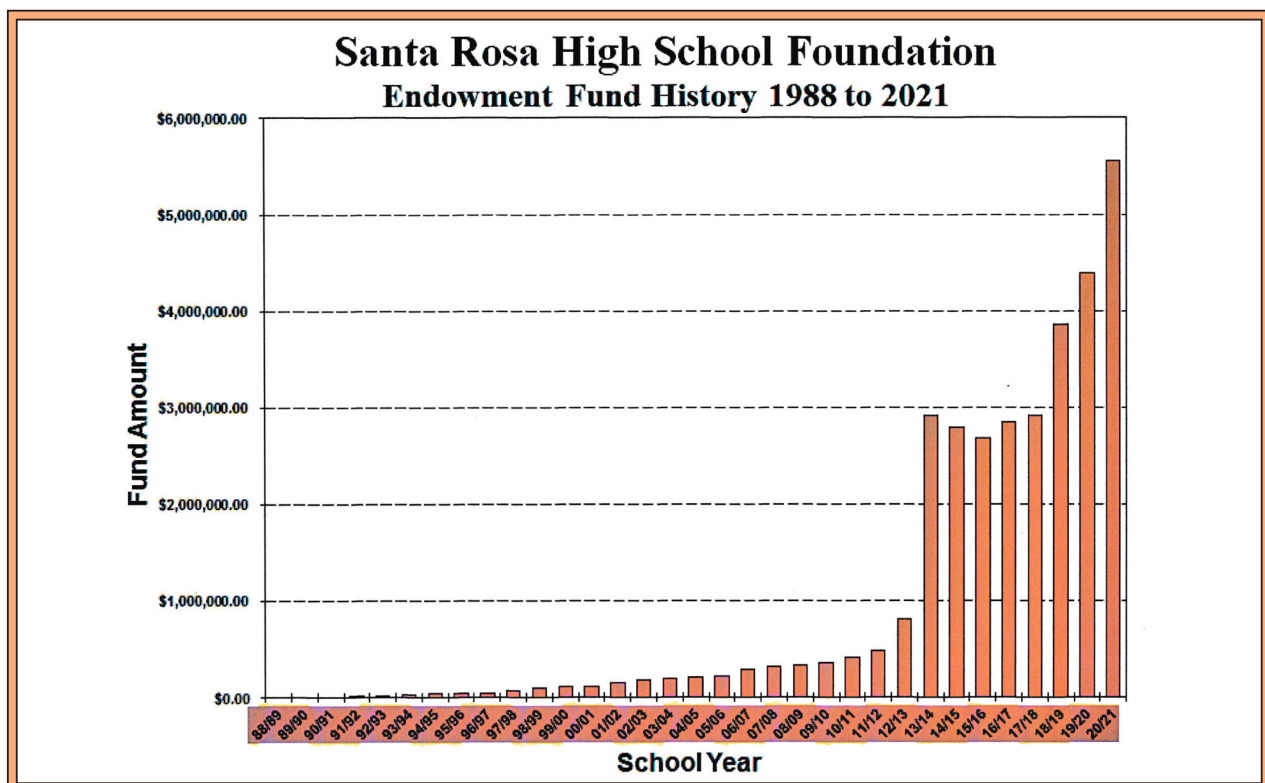
Matching gifts may be the answer.

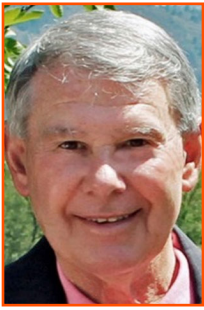

ANNUAL FUND CAMPAIGN 20/21 REPORT

We are pleased to announce once again a very successful Annual Fund Campaign. The 20/21 school year was a challenge for our teachers and students. The pandemic changed the way schools could deliver a proper education. Students and teachers discovered the Zoom process where both students and teachers could communicate to each other through computer links.

This was a difficult process for many, and student grades fell across the nation. This school year offers in-school teaching along with additional electronic training.

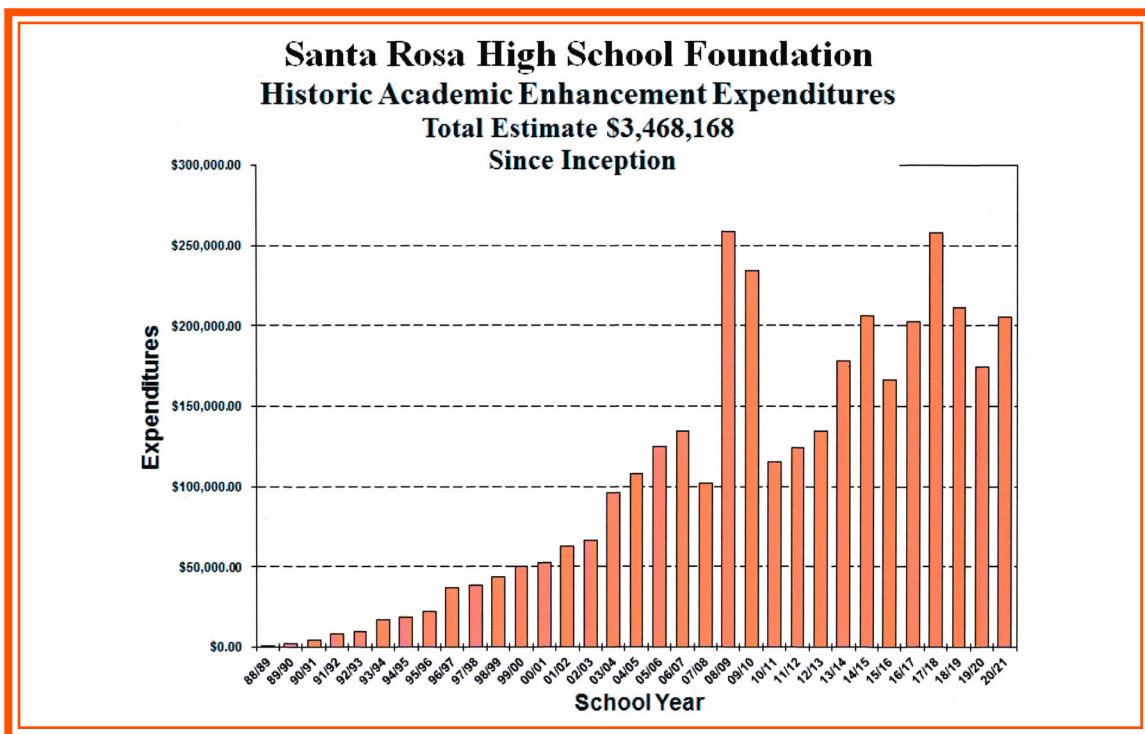
The Santa Rosa High School Foundation Board of Directors, along with our Foundation supporters, have worked diligently to provide financial assistance to Santa Rosa High School. The SRHS Foundation has the best donors and supporters ever! Our 20/21 Annual Fund Campaign contributed considerable financial support to the school, student enhancement programs and to the Foundation's Endowment Fund. A generous \$47,493 was raised during this year's campaign that were directed to the following Departments and Programs: Academics, Agriculture, Artquest, Athletics, Baseball, English, History, Industrial Technology, Metal Shop, Music, Pandys Pantry, PB&J, Science, Track & Field, Visual & Performing Arts, Woodshop, Museum, Boys Soccer and CTE Capital Improvement..

This Campaign provides an opportunity for Foundation members and other SRHS supporters to make tax deductible

donations to SRHS students and programs. Donors at all levels can match a variety of general or specific donations with their personal interests. For example, donors have given unrestricted cash gifts for broad disbursement or selected a specific department or program. They have made "memorial" or "in honor of" gifts to support the ONE THOUSAND PANTHERS Unrestricted Endowment Fund or optionally created a restricted program or scholarship fund (\$10,000 minimum). This 20/21 school year, our ONE THOUSAND PANTHERS program has added \$57,595 in new unrestricted or restricted endowment donations.

The Annual Fund Campaign is an important part of the Foundation's immediate and longer-term fundraising programs. In this newsletter, we have added two historical charts where you will see the Foundation's progress in the growth of our Endowment Fund, now over \$5.55 million and the steady progress in our ability to fund student programs since our inception in 1988. That amount is now over \$3.2 million. We can't thank our donors and supporters enough in this difficult year.
